The Christopher J. Herrle Scholarship was established through the overwhelming generosity of many members of Sinfonia and String Ensemble and friends of Community Music School. The scholarship is not based on financial need or merit, rather on one's *passion for music*. Christopher greatly enjoyed playing music and the camaraderie shared with friends when getting together for jam sessions. This opportunity exists to encourage others to be a part of and experience the inspiring process of making music within a group.

An award in the amount of \$150 will be awarded each fall and each spring for use toward participation in a Community Music School ensemble. There are no restrictions based on age or ability.

How to Apply:

Applicants must write a letter that describes their passion for music and enthusiasm for performance. Included within the letter should be:

- Email address
- An indication of the ensemble of interest

Eligible ensemble programs include: Acoustic Classic Rock Guitar Ensemble, Chamber Connections, Studio 24, Jazz Ensemble, New Horizons Band, String Ensemble, and First Time Fiddlers.

The deadline for consideration for the Fall 2017 award is by 1 pm on August 1, 2017.
